

Trade and Cooperation Agreement between the European Union and the United Kingdom has been temporarily applied since 1 January 2021 and it was published on 31 December 2020 in the Official Journal L 444 and it can be accessed via [https://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/PDF/?uri=CELEX:22020A1231\(01\)&from=HR](https://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/PDF/?uri=CELEX:22020A1231(01)&from=HR).

As of 1 January 2021, Intrastat reporting has been changed in the following specific way: The United Kingdom and the EU recognised the unique situation of Ireland and Northern Ireland; therefore, the Protocol on Ireland and Northern Ireland was concluded, which entered into force on 1 January 2021. The Protocol enabled Northern Ireland to remain an integral part of the customs territory of the United Kingdom, but at the same time to have certain benefits from the single market of the European Union.

The Protocol on Ireland and Northern Ireland for PSIs in the Republic of Croatia (for the reporting period from January 2021 onwards) means the following.

Northern Ireland

The dispatch of goods from the Republic of Croatia to Northern Ireland and the arrival of goods from Northern Ireland to the Republic of Croatia must still be reported in Intrastat forms. The Geonomenclature code „XI“ is to be entered into the field “Country of destination/consignment”.

The rest of the United Kingdom

Trade in goods with the rest of the United Kingdom, which consists of the United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales), the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man (excluding Northern Ireland) is not reported to Intrastat.

Republic of Ireland

Trade in goods with the Republic of Ireland is still reported to Intrastat according to the Geonomenclature code „IE“.
