Project summary

The purpose of this project is to implement LFS 2025 module on "Reconciliation of work and family life" under Work package 1 - Implementation of the 2025 EU-LFS eight-yearly variables on "reconciliation of work and family life".

The project aims at supporting the Croatian Bureau of Statistics to be compliant with the Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2240 of 16 December 2019 and with the Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/2312 of 25 November 2022 and to enhance the quality of the EU-LFS data as regards methodology provided in the framework regulation on Integrated European Social Statistics (EU) 2019/1700 through:

- collecting methodologically sound and valid data in accordance with Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/2312 of 25 November 2022 specifying the technical items of the data set for the 2025 LFS module on "reconciliation of work and family life";
- increasing the comparability of results by using the explanatory notes and proposed model questionnaire as agreed by the LAMAS working group. The LFS 2025 module will be carried out as a supplement to the Labour Force Survey, in every quarter of 2025 on a subsample. Data collection (fieldwork) will be carried out by CAPI interviewing method. The main aim of the project is to produce sound and comparable results among EU countries and to deliver national microdata set to Eurostat in time.

Objectives will be achieved through the following activities: development of national questionnaire and methodology for LFS 2025 module, development of software CAPI application, data collection, data editing, data processing, data validation and transmission of the microdata set to Eurostat via Edamis LFS channel. This LFS 2025 module expects to provide information to specific interest groups, as well as public and government bodies at national and EU level.

PPPs data collection 2025

EG24 PPP

Contract number: 101194537

Implementation period from 01/11/2024 to 28/02/2026

Project summary

The aim of the project is to collect a high-quality data set for calculating parity, first from the lowest levels (SPD level) to basic groups (BHs) to obtain an indicator for calculating GDP by Purchasing Power Parity. The CBS will implement the project through different activities in accordance with the Eurostat PPP work plan. Implementation will be carried out according to the Eurostat / OECD PPP methodology and Regulation (EC) no. Regulation (EC) No 1445/2007 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 December 2007 establishing common rules for the provision of basic information on purchasing power parities and for their calculation and dissemination.

The Croatian Bureau of Statistics will implement the project through eight objectives:

A: Consumer goods price surveys - through this objective CBS will provide data sets that Eurostat use for calculation price level indices (PLIs) which are the ratios of PPPs to exchange rates. They provide a comparison of countries' price levels relative to the European Union average. The EU average is calculated as the weighted average of the national PLIs, weighted with expenditures from national accounts.

B: Estate agencies rents survey - the aim of the rent surveys is to calculate the differences in current rental levels for the same types of property between Brussels and each of the other places where the survey is done. With provide data sets Eurostat will calculate coefficient that will use to ensure equality of purchasing power of salaries in the different duty stations.

C: Capital goods price surveys - the aim of this objective is to provide to Eurostat data sets for two tasks, Construction survey and Equipment's good survey they are used to deflate Gross fixed capital formation (GFCF) expenditures.

D: Hospital price surveys - the aim of this objective is to collect data on internationally comparable quasi-prices for identified hospital products. These quasi-prices will use to calculate hospital output-based PPPs and price level indices; these calculations will be used to make international comparisons of volume-based measures of hospital expenditures and to calculate specific PPPs for health as a whole within the framework of the Eurostat-OECD PPP Programme.

E: Other PPP input data - this objective includes a few different tasks needed for calculation GDP per PPP: GDP expenditure weights, compensation of government employees, actual and imputed rents, VAT and tips for referent years 2022-2023-2024 and CPI questionnaire for 2024.

F: PPP inventory - the aim of this objective is to provide to Eurostat new version of our method and sources that we used in implementation of project in the Republic of Croatia.

G: This objective includes a number of tasks that are useful in the context of the PPP program but for which individual countries may have different needs.

New classification will be delivered for the 2025 data collection of the monetary modules of European economic environmental accounts; Environmental goods and services sector (EGSS) with deadline October 2025, Environmental protection expenditures accounts (EPEA) and Environmental subsidies and similar transfers (ESST) with deadline December 2025.

Main activities that will be a part of the project are the complete revision of EPEA, EGSS and ESST data collection to the new CEP classification as well as the investigation of national data sources from various statistical areas and development of various methods and procedures to compile and report data on climate change investments.

During the project, Croatian Bureau of statistics will work on the upgrade of the existing EPEA and EGSS annual survey by adding the CEP classification and new products relevant for climate change mitigation and adaptation. Applying for this project is based on new legal acts for Household Budget Survey (HBS in the continuation of the text in application) from HBS 2026 wave onwards: Regulation (EU) 2019/1700 Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2180 Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2181 Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/256 Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/2094 Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2023/126 With adopting of new legal acts for HBS, there is a need for changes in conducting the HBS 2026 wave in terms of data collecting, data processing, data imputation, data validation and data quality reporting. Living Conditions Unit which is in charge of conducting HBS, through the project will apply all needed changes in order to be complaint with the requirements of new legal acts.

Planned preparation activities for the HBS 2026 wave are set to start in April 2025 and last to the June 2028, when the last activity – preparing of Final methodological report will be finished.

Although, as it was important to set some activities and objectives in the project, Living Conditions Unit has performed with sample expert some precalculations of needed sample size in order to be complaint with the new legal acts, and those precalculations will be a ground foundation for conducting of HBS 2026 wave. It is also important to state that there has not been any applying for the derogations in HBS regarding new legal acts which makes Living Conditions Unit binding to perform and implement all set activities and objectives outlined in this application. Through the project Living Conditions Unit is planning to implement several new activities which will become regular activities in conducting HBS waves from 2026 onwards, either it will be nationally or regular EU HBS wave.

With provide data sets Eurostat will calculate coefficient that will use to ensure equality of purchasing power of salaries in the different duty stations.

C: Capital goods price surveys - the aim of this objective is to provide to Eurostat data sets for two tasks, Construction survey and Equipment's good survey they are used to deflate Gross fixed capital formation (GFCF) expenditures.

D: Hospital price surveys - the aim of this objective is to collect data on internationally comparable quasi-prices for identified hospital products. These quasi-prices will use to calculate hospital output-based PPPs and price level indices; these calculations will be used to make international comparisons of volume-based measures of hospital expenditures and to calculate specific PPPs for health as a whole within the framework of the Eurostat-OECD PPP Programme.

E: Other PPP input data - this objective includes a few different tasks needed for calculation GDP per PPP: GDP expenditure weights (Tab24), compensation of government employees, actual and imputed rents, VAT and tips for referent years 2023-2024-2025 and CPI questionnaire about HICP indices for 2025 that will use for calculation TAP (Temporal adjustment factor).

F: PPP inventory - the aim of this objective is to provide to Eurostat new version of our method and sources that we used in implementation of project in the Republic of Croatia.

The main outcome is the Purchasing Power Standard (PPS) - an artificial reference currency that eliminates differences in price levels between countries and allows for comparison of the volume of economic indicators in the countries participating in the project.

The aim of the implementation of this project is GDP per PPS - an economic indicator of the economic and material development of the country in comparison with the 36 countries participating in the ECP/PPP project.

Tourism statistics – towards an innovative multi-source integrated production system

Project summary

This project aims to modernise the production of tourism statistics by using mobile network operator (MNO) data as a complementary and innovative data source. Traditional methods, such as surveys, are often limited by timeliness, coverage, and cost. Mobile data can offer a more dynamic, timely, and granular view of tourism flows, particularly for same-day visits and short trips, which are often underreported. In partnership with a national MNO, CBS will develop algorithms to identify same-day and overnight trips made by residents to domestic and foreign destinations. These algorithms will be implemented securely by the MNO, who will return anonymised, aggregated indicators to the CBS. Monthly estimates will be produced at the national level throughout the year. The project will explore the integration of MNO-derived indicators into official statistics using model-based techniques such as regression and calibration. It will also compare mobile-based estimates with traditional sources and assess their quality, consistency, and added value. Expected outputs include a documented methodology, a full set of monthly tourism indicators, and an analysis of data quality and usability. The results will be shared with Eurostat and the broader statistical community. The project is expected to benefit national and European statistical systems, policymakers, and tourism stakeholders by improving data availability, reducing costs, and supporting data innovation in line with EU priorities for digital transformation and smarter statistics.

Project summary

The Central Bureau of Statistics (hereinafter: CBS) maintains the Register of Business Entities (hereinafter: RBS) based on the Act on the National Classification of Activities (NN, No. 98/94), the Decision on the National Classification of Activities 2025 – NKD 2025 (NN, No. 47/24) and the Ordinance on the Classification of Business Entities according to the National Classification of Activities 2025 – NKD 2025 (NN, No. 81/24).

The name of the application (system) that supports the RBS is the Administrative Business Register application (hereinafter: APR). The Administrative Business Register includes legal entities, state authorities, local and regional self-government units and parts of these entities. When registering in APR, the State Bureau of Statistics issues a Notice on the classification of business entities according to the NKD 2025 to business entities and parts of business entities.

In addition to the redesign of the APR application, the intention of DZS is to migrate the application to the Shared Services Centre (hereinafter: CDU) in order to increase the security, scalability and availability of APR as a public registry.

The APR application, as a public register, is recognized as an important segment in the overall administration and data management of legal entities in the Republic of Croatia. Therefore, the priority is that the mentioned application functions in the best possible way.

In terms of business logic, the APR application works according to defined parameters within expectations. However, during the development, older technologies were used, which represent a potential problem in communication with other public registries.

In order to improve the functioning of the APR application, the following is a description of the segments that should be improved.

The project is being implemented for the purpose of redesigning and upgrading the Administrative Business Register of the CBS and migration to the infrastructure of the CDU.
