Statistical concepts and definitions

Motorway, in accordance with the international definition from the Glossary for Transport Statistics (UNECE, ITF and Eurostat – 4th edition), is a public road specially built and intended for the traffic of motor vehicles, having two non-adjoining carriage ways for traffic (green area, protective fence, etc.) in either direction with at least two lanes considering the configuration of the terrain – and one emergency lane, no crossing with roads, railways or tramways on the same level and with specially constructed lanes for speeding or slowing down and junctions for access or exit which make traffic safer and easier; the motorway is marked with a prescribed traffic sign.

Express road, in accordance with the international definition from the Glossary for Transport Statistics (UNECE, ITF and Eurostat – 4th edition), is a public road specially built and intended for the traffic of motor vehicles, having one or two non-adjoining carriage ways for traffic, with crossings with roads in two or more levels (railways or tramways), without emergency lane, and as a rule it is marked with a prescribed traffic sign.

State road is a public road that connects the whole territory of the Republic of Croatia and connects it with the network of main European roads.

County road is a public road that connects the territory of one or more counties

Local road is a public road which belongs to the network of county roads and connects the territories of a town (city) and/or municipality.

E-road is a public road included in the international road network under international agreements.

Statistical units

All public classified roads are included, that is, those categorised as state, county or local motorways.

Statistical population

Classified roads in the Republic of Croatia.

Until 2010, the total length of express roads was included in the length of state roads. In order to achieve better presentation and international comparability of data, since 2011, part of the express roads that are categorised as motorways are presented in the length of motorways. In order to obtain comparable data series, the data from 2007 to 2010 were revised, and part of the express roads are presented in the length of motorways, and part in the length of state roads. In 2012, the re-classification of public roads was done (the Decision on the Classification of Public Roads and the Decision on Roads on the Territory of Major Cities No Longer Classified as Public Roads; NN, No. 44/12). County and local roads in cities were re-classified into urban roads, thus becoming unclassified roads that are not in the competence of Hrvatske ceste d.o.o.

5.2.1. Length of comparable time series
